Observations about the correlation among Smarter, DCAS, PSAT, SAT scores, school or district common assessments, and student grades:

Decrease in student test scores based on the implementation of two new curricula in ELA/Writing (Benchmark) and Math (Bridges). Both curricula spiral, which requires students to have prior knowledge moving up in grade levels. Once the student cycle through at least two years of the curricula, then test scores should improve. Benchmark and Bridges training is provided through district created ELA and Math Lead Teacher Meetings.
